- \_ *Office of Educational Accessibility: Melena Walters*

- Attended the Open house events with delta alpha pi. Delta Alpha Pi invited all OEA students to an event dedicated to amplifying the voices of disabled students and faculty at WCU. This event is an opportunity to share experiences and collaborate on a campus-wide pamphlet about your experiences living with a disability, bringing awareness to others on WCU's Campus. I had attended the event, and it was very meaningful. I had a chance to have meaningful conversations from other leaders in the disability community who are also using their voice to make a difference. It was amazing to have this event to bring us all together for Fraternity members and non-Fraternity members.
- There are many Updates for the 2024-2025 School Year. There are Wednesday evening study halls open to all supervised by OEA Staff. New to Wayne Hall building, space is accessible and successful for students. This allows more students to test at once and gives all the GAs their own office for student confidentiality. We also now have a full proctor desk with so many materials to help students be successful before and after testing. Color printing is available for OEA students. 6 GAs that do academic success programs and also help out student workers New associate director Dr. Aaron Spector has been appointed as the first associate director and Main point person to run office day to day, such as communication from professor to student, testing problems, or drop in hours, while Dr. Thomas oversees the whole department and deals with the more intense issues and scenarios that require more attention. A lot more job opportunities for students with flexible schedules, looking for more employees for leadership positions, flexible hours and days 1-5 hour shifts. The OEA office is also looking for a student ambassador run by the GAs. This will entail attending our Transition Day Events, going to Open Houses, attending classrooms to briefly explain student accommodations, and being a student representative of the office. It is a great opportunity to get more involved with campus and a resume booster.

- Met with Dean Leach, on 3/3/25.
  - Discussed issues with vending machines not opening and giving people their food, the issue was students pulling on the door too quickly. The solution was to put a sign on the doors of the vending machines. We also talked about past events and their successes. Also the news of the start of the Real estate minor, Unmanned aerial certification (Drones), and emergency response certification.

- ***\_ Campus Recreation: Liam Mautner***

  - Discussed that the outdoor court is approved, funding is set aside and we are waiting on final date for construction company the project should be done by

the end of semester. They are putting in Pickleball courts where sand volleyball space is right now. I brought up the idea of using the space in the residential quad for some sort of rec related space. (spike ball, sand volleyball court, ability to rent sports equipment from USH dorms to be used in the residential quad). Intramural Basketball is in the playoffs and is wrapping up. The rec center is offering 50 group classes a week, a growing presence of group fitness on campus. The rec is offering sensory friendly events and sensory accommodations at a collaborative level with other orgs in an effort to make recreation more inclusive on campus. The rec center is giving student orgs good access to facilities and remains a top priority for campus recreation leaders. Accepted students' day will be held at the rec on 3/29 and 4/12.
