The Speech and Hearing Clinic is located at West Chester University at 201 Carter Drive, Suite 400, in the Matlack Industrial Park. Parking is available in front of the building.

DRIVING DIRECTIONS

From north of West Chester: Take Route 202 South and take the Matlack Street exit (turning right onto Matlack Street). Turn right onto Carter Drive to enter the Matlack Industrial Park, Suite 400.

From south of West Chester: Take Route 202 North and take the Matlack Street Exit (turning left onto Matlack Street). Turn right onto Carter Drive to enter the Matlack Industrial Park, Suite 400.

provides superior professional diagnostic and treatment services in speech-language pathology and audiology while providing excellence in clinical education for students in the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders.

Students are supervised by speech-language pathologists and audiologists, all holding professional certification from the

American Speech-Language-Hearing Association and licensure from the state of Pennsylvania. Clinical Supervisors use state-of-the-art video technology to observe students during clinical sessions. Therapy sessions are offered once or twice a week during the fall and spring semesters. Summer programs are offered throughout the day during the month of July.

DIAGNOSTIC CLINICAL SERVICES FOR CHILDREN AND ADULTS

The Clinic offers free full diagnostic evaluations for children and adults suspected of having speech, language, voice, feeding, swallowing, cognitive-communication, or hearing disorders. We also offer free diagnostic evaluations for individuals interested in modifying aspects of their communication (e.g., accent, professional speaking, voice training, etc.). Using the latest equipment, technologies, and assessment tools, the diagnostic team provides comprehensive evaluations. Student clinicians have access to the latest technology used to perform advanced diagnostic procedures that can directly assess middle and inner ear function and hearing loss. We also offer bilingual Spanish-English evaluations.

PREVENTION AND TREATMENT SERVICES FOR CHILDREN AND ADULTS

For those diagnosed with speech, language, voice, feeding, swallowing, cognitive-communication, or hearing disorders, the Clinic offers free treatment sessions for children and adults. We also offer free prevention and treatment sessions for individuals interested in



modifying aspects of their communication (e.g., accent, professional speaking, voice training, etc.). Sessions are offered once or twice a week during the fall and spring semesters. Summer programs are offered throughout the day during the month of July. We offer bilingual Spanish-English prevention and treatment sessions.

HEARING RELATED SERVICES

In addition to the various speech and language-based services, our clinic provides a wide array of hearing assessment and therapy services. We use state of the art, modern diagnostic assessment technology to assess patients ranging from infants to adults using middle ear immittance measurements, diagnostic testing, and hearing in noise assessments. We also provide Auditory Processing evaluations for any individual age seven and older.

Our therapy services include speech/lip reading, listening enhancement techniques, group hearing therapy, and cochlear implant intensive listening therapy. All therapies and testing are free of charge.
